BOOK MANUSCRIPT

Family Conceptions: Technologies of Asian American Family Formation

This book project combines archival and ethnographic methods to examine Asian American family formation in the 20th and 21st centuries as a site in which the borders of racial difference are articulated. Building on scholarship in Asian American Studies and Women, Gender, and Sexuality Studies, *Family Conceptions* theorizes what I term "technologies of family" – technical systems that inform racialized and gendered definitions of kinship – that have played an active role in the way family is narrated and lived in American culture. The central claim of the project is that in the United States, as discourses of multiculturalism have gained popularity in the second half of the 20th century, family serves as a site of social production in which the limits of inclusion within the nation rely on racialized and gendered technologies such as government bureaucracy or photography.
